DISCLOSURE OF EDUCATION RECORDED ALTH AND SAFETY EMERGENCIES

If the university determines that there is articulable and significant threat to the health or safety of a student or other individuals, FERPA allows disclosure of information from education redords propriate parties whose knowledge of the information is necessary to protect the health and safety of the student or other individuals.

- x "Articulable and significant threat" means that if a school official can explain why, based on all the information then available, he or shreasonably believes that a student poses a significant threath, as a threat of substantial bodily harm, to any person, including the student uther ersity may disclose education records to any person whose knowledge of information from those records will assist in protecting a person from that threat.
- x "Appropriate parties" include parents of the student; parents may be notified when there is a health or safety emergency involving their son or daughter.

In makinga determination to disclosenformation, the universitymay take into account the totality of the circumstances pertaining to a threat to the safety or health of the student or other individalsemergency can be related to the threat of an actual, impending, or imminent emergency, such as a terrorist attack, a natural disaster, a campus shooting, or the outbreak of an epidemic suchcals eAn emergency can also be a situation in which a student gives sufficient, cumulative warning signs that leaddheol officiato believe the student may harm himself or others at any moment.

The FERPAccordkeeping requirements equire the university to record 1) the articulable and significant threat that formed the basis for the disclosure and the parties to whom the information was disclosed this record will demonstrate what irrumstances led to the determination
